In addition to welcoming Rev. John Ma, his spouse Christine, and their daughter, Anastasia, beginning July 1st, we will also be hosting Ryan Schellenberg, Assistant Professor of New Testament at Methesco as he writes during his sabbatical. Ryan will join us for worship on June 3 and then return after some travel to use one of the offices off the Commons Area to work on his project. He will be leading some educational opportunities for us in the months to come. He describes the work before him in this way:

Many people know that Paul wrote his letter to the Philippians while in prison. But what was prison like in Paul's time? And how is Paul's experience of prison reflected in his letter? My research project focuses on prison as a context for interpreting Paul's letter to the Philippians. I'm working to uncover what we can know about prison in the ancient world—living conditions, legal functions, and also cultural assumptions and stereotypes people had about prisoners—and then to show how understanding this context helps us make sense of Paul's letter. Part of the project too is to think about those who are in prison in our own society and how remembering early Christian experiences of incarceration might affect our attitudes toward prison and prisoners today.

You will be hearing more about Ryan's work and opportunities to learn from him in the days to come. For those of you who have signed up to be in the initial team for the Northland Outreach, we will be gathering in early July.

A big THANK YOU to all our choirs for a wonderful music season. Take a peak in this Messenger to see the special music that will be filling our summer! Plan to participate and enjoy. With summer comes 8:30 am Worship in the Potter Chapel on Sunday mornings and frequent Outdoor Emerge Worship. For the month of June we will hope to be outside at 11:15 am on June 17 and June 24.

Early Saturday, April 21, 2018, eight WUMC members left for a one-day adult mission trip to the Hocking Hills area and Camp Otterbein, one of the UMC's camps. The group included Brad Arensberg, Frank Birinyi, Ken Evans, Jerry Knorr, Russ Line, Eric Oldenburg, Duane Snyder, and Aura Whittaker. It is noteworthy that WUMC is the longest tenured work group at Camp Otterbein.

After sufficient coffee and doughnuts, the group met with Camp Director Scott Seese to review the project details. The project involved winterizing one of their cabins. (The camp is open year-round.) The cabin had eight very sturdy bunk beds which had to be moved around in order to give us room to work. The inside walls, including around the windows, were to be framed to provide a level surface for plywood. This was in preparation for subsequent crews who were to install electricity and insulation and then finally attach plywood sheets to the framing. By the end of the day, both sides of the cabin were completely framed, except for some trim work around three windows. A section of one end of the cabin was completed as well.

A nice lunch was provided by the Camp not only to our group, but also to a Grove City Trinity UMC men's group who was at the Camp for a weekend retreat.

Two members of our group completed a "Hammock City" project. Previously, 9 posts had been planted in concrete, the upright posts at the intersecting points of a 4x4 grid. Eye bolts were secured in place on each post. In total, almost 20 hammocks could be easily attached In "Hammock City", in a variety of configurations. The church van was used for transport, and we arrived back at WUMC at 5:35 p.m.



Sign up now for the next adult mission trip. The dates are August 26 – 31, 2018. We will be working at The Nehemiah Mission of Cleveland. They are a United Methodist Church Mission. Their mission is to rebuild the lives and homes of the physically and fiscally challenged of Cleveland. We worked there the last four years. It was a great place, and it's not a long drive. If some of you would like to go for just a couple of days, we can probably make that happen. The last date to sign up for this mission trip is August 12, 2018.
