We are on a journey, each of us and together. As we wander through this Lenten season we are met with floods nearby us, the tragic taking of young life, heightened anxiety and division within our community and country and growing needs around the world. And we are met by Jesus on his journey to the cross, asking us to follow – giving up, letting go and breaking free.

In this Messenger we celebrate ways you have and are responding to need by your involvement and we know that the numbers here are not inclusive of all the ways that we each reach out and seek to make a difference in the world – but they are indicative of what we know at this time and place and the records we keep. As you look inside this Messenger, you may also see new ways you can enter into outreach and ministry. Check them out and give them a try.

As you journey through Lent please be in prayer for those who are victims of flooding and know if you would like to contribute, any gift you give through WUMC that is marked for flood disaster relief will be used 100% for that purpose. We will make you aware of additional ways to be of service in response to flooding damage as they materialize.

Also, please be in prayer for the tension places in our world, country and community. Today I heard from a teacher with over thirty years of experience speak of the anxiety and tension inside the suburban school in which she teaches. I have told many of you that when I was in junior high we had many bomb threats and drug raids, spent much time in the gym when we arrived at school and in the parking lot throughout the day as the building was searched. Yet, the world is different today. Perhaps we are in disagreement about how we count school shootings or how today's tensions compare to the past, but there seem to be some nuances to our ways of life today--- automatic assault weapons kill more quickly and in greater numbers than other prominent weapons of the past; and some of the drugs with which persons experiment today are laced with chemicals that make their first-time use a more lethal probability.

I am aware we do not all agree on the answers to the issues which face us, but I do believe we all care. And maybe there are some things we can agree on. Bishop Palmer is encouraging churches and individuals to take part in an offering of letters to our government officials, state and national, to prioritize the safety and sanctuary of our children amidst this repetitive and escalating violence. In the church office we have information on participating in the support of commonsense background checks for gun purchasers and copies of the UMC Book of Resolutions #3428 Our Call to End Gun Violence for those who would like to read it.

Finally, you will see in this Messenger a schedule for Holy Week and all it offers. Once again we will join with St. John's AME Church for Maundy Thursday and our Chancel Choir will help us to remember on Good Friday, to remember the saving grace of Jesus the Christ. As we journey through the Lenten Season may we be open to God's gentle and not so gentle call on our lives! And, yes, Easter is on April 1; that's no April Fool's joke!

Bags of Blessings sees a great start with Buddy Bags

Thank you to our church family for the great start to our 2018 Bags of Blessings! Our January collection was for Buddy Bags through Family Mentor Foundation. This organization began in 2013 with a mission to create services that help fill in the area's lacking in a child's life. They seek to help meet the unmet needs of children in our community through a variety of programs and resources that will help them reach their full potential. One of their programs is Buddy Bags. Many children who qualify for free or reduced fee lunch at their schools have little to eat at home and return to school after weekends distracted by their hunger and unable to focus on learning. Buddy Bags bridge this gap by providing a disposable bag or box filled with kid-friendly, nutritious, individual sized, non-perishable food items that are easy for children to eat and prepare on their own. This food helps sustain the children on weekends when they are not in school.

In January, we collected **53 bags** filled with individual microwaveable dinner cups like ravioli and chicken, shelf stable milk, pudding cups, fruit cups, vegetable cups, granola bars, oatmeal packs and peanut butter. **This was our biggest collection in years.** Kari Vernon at Family Mentor Foundation was overwhelmed by our donation. What a show of support for children in Worthington Schools, Columbus City Schools and Southwestern City Schools, where this program is currently providing services. A huge thank you to this church family, who continues to provide to so many in need, and show God's love way beyond our church doors. A special thank you to our Bags of Blessings sorters month after month, Mark and Michelle Hadley, Charles and Ann Tarr, and Mike and Melissa Alexander.

9054 hours! 1796 volunteers! \$56,200 in material goods! WUMC MADE A DIFFERENCE IN 2017!

Last year we recorded 9054 hours of time donated to a variety of mission projects; 1796 volunteers participating in a variety of mission projects; and \$56,200 worth of materials, supplies, and goods donated to support a variety of mission projects.

While we had a 2% decrease in the number of hours donated over the previous year, and a 1% decrease in the number of people who participated in mission giving projects, we saw a 105% increase in materials, supplies, and goods donated. 105% increase!! And an additional \$15,064 was given in Second Mile donations.

More and more people at WUMC are making a difference!

If you participated in any of these ministries or others unnamed, and you made a difference for someone else. If you gave your time, you made a difference. If you gave 2nd mile money or goods, you made a difference. If you made, gave, or served food you made a difference. If you made a sleeping mat, gave a unit of blood, gave a bag of blessing, or partnered with a student to practice reading, you made a difference. If you walked, worked, sorted, cleaned, or built, you made a difference. Making a difference can take as much or as little time as you want. If you're interested in getting yourself, your children and youth, your family, your neighborhood, your coworkers, or a random group of friends together to make a difference, there's something for every age and ability to do! Previous experience not needed – just a desire to make a difference!


Scouting Grows at WUMC with addition of Venturing Crew

The Scouting program at Worthington United Methodist Church is being expanded! As many know, Boy Scout Troop 365 has been a part of our church family for over 66 years. Recently, the WUMC Administrative Council approved the charter of an additional group for older Scouts. This program is known as Venturing.

Venturing is a youth development program of the Boy Scouts of America for young men and women who are 13 and have completed the eighth grade, or age 14 through 20 years of age. Venturing's purpose is to provide positive experiences to help young people mature and to prepare them to become responsible and caring adults. Venturing crews can specialize in a variety of avocation or hobby interests. Our crew is still planning its future activities but clearly community service and outdoor adventure unique to this age group are high priorities. As the chartering organization for Troop 365, and now Venturing Crew 247, we can be proud of the experiences they provide the youth of our community.
