A LETTER FROM PASTOR DOM

A quote (dubiously) attributed to Martin Luther says, "Work, work; I have so much to do tomorrow that I shall spend the first three hours in prayer." Many things demand our attention and our time; getting the kids to their practices, keeping up with the news, meeting deadlines at work, advocating with those who are continuously marginalized by those who hold power, and finding an hour to catch up on our favorite show.

It can be hard to find time for prayer, but prayer is critical in tending to our faith. It interrupts cycles of both anxious production and escapism by connecting us to the One who created us, redeems us, and sustains us. This deepens our compassion and helps us to respond to the world's needs with wisdom. Maybe we can't commit to praying three hours a day, but we can take a few steps to nurture our prayer life. Here are some ways to get started:

- 1.Set aside time as sacred. Try and pray at the same time in your morning or evening routines every day. Prepare your body, mind, and spirit with a simple ritual, such as lighting a candle or touching water in a bowl to remind you of your baptism.
- 2.Find a Bible reading plan or devotional that works for you. Reading from scripture and from the writings of other people of faith helps to center our hearts and minds on God. I've found A Guide to Prayer for All Who Walk with God by the Upper Room and This Day: A Wesleyan Way of Prayer by Laurence Hull Stookey to be particularly useful.
- 3. Recruit a buddy. Seek out someone who will help you meet your prayer commitments and wants the same help. Pray for each other and check-in weekly.
- 4. Begin with gratitude. Gratitude is the foundation of a life of prayer. No matter how crummy things are, you have received grace and God loves you unconditionally. Prayer begins with the awareness of this unconditional love.
- 5.Keep a prayer list. Once centered in God's love, we can then extend compassion to those who have requested our prayers. Keep the Church's prayer list near when praying and add those who ask you personally for prayer. It's the spirit of compassion, not the perfect words, that matters.
- 6.End with the Lord's Prayer. This prayer connects us to all the faithful across time who have lifted the same prayer to God.
- 7.Remember: faith ain't linear. You will eventually oversleep, get distracted, or decide not to pray. It's okay. Acknowledge the mistake and recognize that there is no shame in missing prayer - only grace in returning to it. Get back on that horse.

Prayer connects us to God, moves us to act with compassion toward our neighbors, and grounds us in grace. Your church family and pastors are here to support you as you grow in your prayer life.

REACHOUT

This is for those currently in 7th grade and older. ReachOut is a United Methodist Camp that happens each July in Lakeside, Ohio. If you are unfamiliar with Lakeside, it is a beautiful, gated community right on Lake Erie. One of the perks of this camp is the location itself! Campers and counselors stay in cabins and lodge housing for the week, located close to the downtown area with shops, putt-putt, and the best ice cream and donuts! There are worship services each night, a two-day mission component where we serve local non-profits around northern Ohio, sports and art activities, and a chance to get to know youth from other churches. A unique and valuable aspect of ReachOut is that it is planned and run by a group of high school youth who are elected by the previous year's campers. That group of students meet year-round to pick the theme verse we build our week around, plan fun activities, and even speak and lead messages at our worship services. It is a great way to experience student leadership! Ashley Gerard, along with other youth leaders from the church, serve as camp counselors for the week. ReachOut 2025 dates are July 13 – July 19.

FEBRUARY MISSION TRIP RECAP

On February 23rd Brad Arensberg, Russ Line, Eric Oldenburg, and Duane Snyder left for a six-day mission trip to Hinton Center in Hayesville, North Carolina. Paul George met us there since he was already in Tennessee. It was a ten-hour drive with stops for meals and gas. After unpacking our gear and tools, we had dinner in the dining hall.

On this trip we worked on a house in Georgia. Hinton Center is on the North Carolina / Georgia border. On the first day and one half we put railings around a 12' by 8' porch that was right outside the kitchen. We also installed a ramp that came off the porch. On the next two- and one-half days we installed railings around a 36' by 8' porch. We build a set of stairs on both ends of the porch. On one of these days, we removed a window air conditioner from a downstairs window.

While this outside work was going on, we had a team working inside. There was a narrow staircase that went up to the second floor. The opening above the stairs was covered by a door that laid flat on the floor of the second floor. The door was quite heavy and had to be pushed up from the stairs. It had hinges on one side of the door and leaned against a bedroom wall on the second floor when it was open. We took out the door and built two walls. One wall was a frame that would support the door that would be standing up like a regular door at the top of the stairs. This connected to the wall of a bedroom. The second wall ran along the other side of the hole at the top of the stairs and connected to the wall that would support the door. This wall was completely framed out with studs, insulation, and wall board on both sides. The door was made from the wood of the old door. The staircase was up against one wall. We attached grab bars to the wall going up the stairs. We also attached grab bars above the wall to provide additional help in climbing the stairs.

We managed to stop at the ice cream store on one day of the trip.

This is your chance to be the hands and feet of Jesus in carrying out his work. Join us for a time of fun and fellowship while we are carrying out God's work. I guarantee that you will have a good time and that the food will be great (don't plan to lose any weight). Don't feel that you have to have a lot of skills in order to participate. We do the best we can with the skills that the members of the team have, and there is always something that everyone can do. The trip is not just for men, if you are so inclined. More information will be available when we set the date and place for the next trip. For those who have trouble getting away, we usually plan a one day mission trip in the spring and fall. This year we have been having trouble lining up a place to go. Information will be provided as it becomes available. BAGS OF BLESSINGS - APRIL

The Worthington Resource Pantry opened in 2009 and is a non-profit community-based organization. WRP offers a CHOICE food pantry and serves 8 zip codes in northern Franklin and southern Delaware counties (43016, 43035, 43065, 43081, 43085, 43229, 43235 and 43240). Each eligible household can receive three days of food & personal items twice each month. Hours are Mondays 10 am – 2 pm, Wednesdays 3 pm – 7 pm, Thursdays 3 pm – 5 pm, and Saturdays 10 am – noon. In 2024 WRP provided over 6,764,000 meals and served 631,377 neighbors! WRP sponsors educational & health programs and provides trained counselors to help families meet other basic needs. The resource center offers job and health care information and Ohio Benefit Bank referrals. See www.worthingtonresourcepantry.org. We invite you to join in this important effort by donating the items listed. As always, feel free to purchase any or all of the items on the list. In April we are collecting items for the Bags of Blessings for the Worthington Resource Pantry. Please return the bags by Sunday, April 27th. Please drop off items for Bags of Blessings in the bins in the office. This month we are collecting: Canned Fruit, Canned Vegetables or Tomatoes, Canned Beans, Canned Soups, Canned Ravioli, Chili or Stew, Peanut Butter, Cereal or Oatmeal, Boxed Rice or Packaged Side Dishes, Shampoo or Deodorant, Toothpaste or Bar Soap.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE OFFICE

The Community Relief Fund (CRF) is used to help individuals with real and immediate financial needs. Originally called the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, the fund was renamed in 2023 to better reflect its use to help members of our community keep a roof over their heads, food in their bellies, gas and electric in their homes, as well meet other requested needs.

Currently the pastors work with individuals to understand their needs, spend time verifying the need (such as calling a landlord or utility company), and processing or requesting the payments. All payments are made directly to the party that is owed to ensure it is used for the needed purpose. Money is never given to individuals directly.

In 2024, the CRF provided over \$25,000 in assistance for 48 households. The 4 main categories for assistance for 2024:

- 20 Rental Payments
- 20 Utility Payments
- 7 Hotel Stavs
- \$1000 in Kroger Gift cards purchased

In 2024, the CRF was funded by individual designated donations as well as a percentage of our Easter and Christmas offerings. Last year, 30% of the CRF income came from our holiday offerings! This Easter, we have another opportunity to share with those in need. The Leadership Board has decided 50% of the Easter offering will go to the CRF. This is a higher percentage than last year, but given the good financial standing of the church, it was decided to share a larger portion with those who are truly in need. Look for more information in the Easter letter which will go out in early April.
