Dear Friends,

May we Dive Deeply into the Hope, Peace, Joy and Love of Christmas! December is almost here and in this unusual year, the season of Advent begins on December 1st. Many of us will likely have some leftovers from Thanksgiving still

available when we sing the first Advent song.

Several persons of all ages gathered this afternoon and decorated many areas of the church. It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas. Yet we know that the journey of Advent with its waiting, anticipation, patience and preparation is extremely important to the celebration of Christmas. In this Messenger and the included program booklet you will find many opportunities to guide you as you dive deeply on your journey through this season. Once again, Mary Scott has put together an Advent Calendar which is included as well.

You will see on the front of the program booklet that we are asking persons to bring items to share each week, if they would like, beginning with dish towels on December 1st. Tonight someone told me she had participated in sharing gifts with teens a few years ago in a project much like our Angel Tree, and the teenager for whom she was to get the gift said he would like sheets. It had an impact on her and I would add on me as she shared her story. In this season of giving please feel free to participate in all opportunities you would find meaningful.

We are adding an additional Christmas worship service this year. It will be a Blue Christmas service and will be held on Sunday, December 22nd at 3:00 pm in the Potter Chapel. This will be a quiet, reflective service especially for those who do not find Christmas to be a joyful time. And on Christmas Eve we will have our four services – at 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm, 8:00 pm and 11:00 pm. Descriptions of the services can be found inside.

As we get the Advent study ready and all the other preparations done, please know we are also working on the 2020 Budget. On December 10th at 7:05 p.m. we will have a special Church Conference for the setting of the pastors' salaries, and that evening as an Administrative Council we plan to set the 2020 Budget. Our Finance Committee, as they bring forward the Budget recommendation, rely in part on the commitments that are given to the church. If you still have a commitment to turn in, please do so in the next few days and it will be very helpful in our budget decisions.

Thank you so much for the commitment which have already been received and for the outpouring of giving. With everyone working together we hope to end 2019 with all responsibilities met and some balance to enter 2020.
