Dear Worthington Church Family,

The season of Christmas will turn into Epiphany on January 6. So if you are a fan of the song, *Twelve Days of Christmas*, you know that there's more gift giving to be done.

Several years back, I read an article that I remember every time I hear that song. It was a young man's story of the girl he was dating and how seriously she took the items on the list of gifts. Bags of Blessings for January to benefit the NNEMAP Food Pantry

The NNEMAP Food Pantry is a cooperative ministry of over 30 churches (including WUMC) distributing food and material assistance to needy residents of Columbus. Their service area primarily includes the Short North, Downtown, Weinland Park, University District and Linden zip codes (43201, 43211, 43215 and 43224), but there are currently no zip code restrictions. Established in 1969, NNEMAP has become one of the largest food pantries in Franklin County. Their clientele consists of families living in or near poverty. For 2020 they served over 1,500 families per month. The pantry is located at a former VFW hall at the corner of Essex and 11th Avenue, just a block west of I-71. Hours are Saturday 10 am – 1 pm, Thursday 3 pm – 6 pm, and other weekdays 9 am– noon. Refer to www.nnemappantry.org for more information.



2023 Disciplines Book of Daily Devotions

There is a sign-up sheet in the church office for anyone who wishes to purchase a copy of the Upper Room Disciplines 2023 book of daily devotions that is used by the Prayer/Study group on Monday mornings. The group is also welcoming new members.



Disciplines 2023 is based on the Revised Common Lectionary, a three-year cycle of Sunday scripture readings. Disciplines features: a focal scripture passage for each day, short daily meditations from 53 thought leaders from diverse Christian traditions, a reflection or prayer to carry with you each day, weekly scripture overviews, an index of scripture readings, and a guide to daily prayer.

The church will order books in your choice of regular or large-print, with payment due in December on receipt of your copy. The regular edition costs \$17, and the large-print edition costs \$20. Please place your order in the church office.

Summer Camp Dates 2023

Save the dates now for our annual summer camps! VBS – Monday, June 12 – Friday, June 16 Work Camp – Sunday, June 25 – Friday, June 30 ReachOut – Sunday, July 9 – Saturday, July 15 Explorations – Monday, July 31 – Thursday, Aug 3

Below is a brief summary of each of these:

Vacation Bible School – VBS is offered for children ages 3 years through 3rd grade. We offer dinner for your whole family each night, followed by programming broken into small groups and stations by age! Each night, children experience lessons surrounding our theme through stations including science, crafts, games, Bible story led by our Pastors Lou and Dom, and music led by our children's choir directors Tim Byrer and Erin Angel. Dinner begins at 5:30pm, then programming follows from 6-8pm. We always need LOTS of helpers – so please consider volunteering now. In order for VBS to be successful, it takes approximately the same amount of volunteers as we have children participating! We cannot do it without a village of servant hearts coming together to offer a safe and fun experience for our youngest members.

Work Camp – Work Camp is our annual youth mission trip, offered to students entering their freshman year of high school in Fall of 2023, to those who have graduated Spring of 2023. We travel out-of-state with our high school students to serve a local community alongside adult leaders. Our location for this year is still to be determined, but if you are interested in attending, contact Ashley for more information.

ReachOut – ReachOut is a week-long camp offered through East Ohio Camps, taking place in Lakeside, Ohio. Our youth have been attending this camp for 20 years, and have often been involved in the youth leadership that plans the camp. The week of camp is planned by a small group of juniors and seniors in high school, and they help lead the week of events. A 2-day overnight mission experience offsite is also a major component of the week. It is a great way to meet youth from other churches and to spend a week at Lake Erie for fun, mission, and fellowship.

Explorations – Explorations is our camp for 4th-6th graders. This camp occurs during the day on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of the week. We meet at the church, pack a lunch, then travel offsite to a local organization to get volunteer experience, then travel back for pick-up at the church. We meet during the day as we serve directly at local organizations. It is a great way to gain volunteer experience and to grow with others at the church.
