A LETTER FROM PASTOR TAD

Travelling with Paul

In 2004, Janet and I had the privilege of going to Greece and Turkey to visit some of the places Paul had visited. This was an Educational Opportunities tour for the West Ohio Conference and Bishop Ough was with us, as well as a few other leaders and scholars. It was a great trip. We went with members of our church in Chillicothe so we were among friends the whole time. We saw a lot and learned a lot and it was very thought-provoking.

The most obvious contrast between our travels and Paul's travels was the difference in transportation modes. We just got on a plane, flew to the other side of the world, sailed through the Adriatic and Aegean Seas (with a little, but quite rough time in the Mediterranean Sea), and then rode in comfortable coaches when we travelled inland. Paul probably walked a lot or rode an animal. Not as fast, not as comfortable. It's hard to imagine what it was really like for those courageous people.

Another easy contrast centers on people. As I said, we were travelling with some friends from Chillicothe, a couple hundred other West Ohio folks, plus even the Bishop. We were among people we could trust, who spoke our language, believed the same things we did, and carried some authority even though we were outside of our own country. So we were always with "our own." This was not the case for Paul. While he always had a few companions with him, that was it: a few. He was going into areas where different languages were spoken, different traditions were observed, and different beliefs were held. I'm sure he could find people to communicate with, and he usually located synagogues to be with other Jews, but there was a lot of time in foreign territory.

To talk a little more about the people, most people we encountered were glad we were there (and had US dollars to spend)! One exception was a woman in Athens who really didn't like President Bush and told us all about it! For the most part, we were welcomed everywhere we went. People were happy to tell us about their country and their history and we learned a great deal. Perhaps the happiest to see us, though, were the merchants in Kusadasi, Turkey. We heard that we were the last cruise ship of the season (we were there in November) and there was lots of stuff to sell us. Some of the merchants practically dragged us into their stores and offered some amazing deals.

Paul experienced some of this, but he wasn't being dragged into a store by people wanting him to buy something. Often, he was dragged before a local assembly to make an account of himself or dragged to the local prison. He was beaten and imprisoned many times. But he kept going! Paul was not going to be deterred from his mission. His faith, his courage, his physical fortitude, and his commitment were second to none. We are thankful that Paul was so dedicated to sharing the Good News of Jesus. His work brought many to Jesus then, and his writings continue to bring people to Jesus now. So many people throughout history have contributed to our faith and helped keep the church alive.

If you have any travel plans this summer, as many of us usually do, take a few minutes when you're staring at a beautiful sunset, or enjoying a wonderful meal in an exotic location, or just sitting in a state park, to think of Paul. His travels introduced people to Jesus, and his writings still do. Enjoy your summer. But watch out for those merchants in Kusadasi!





REACHOUT

This is for those currently in 7th grade and older. ReachOut is a United Methodist Camp that happens each July in Lakeside, Ohio. If you are unfamiliar with Lakeside, it is a beautiful, gated community right on Lake Erie. One of the perks of this camp is the location itself! Campers and counselors stay in cabins and lodge housing for the week, located close to the downtown area with shops, putt-putt, and the best ice cream and donuts! There are worship services each night, a two-day mission component where we serve local non-profits around northern Ohio, sports and art activities, and a chance to get to know youth from other churches. A unique and valuable aspect of ReachOut is that it is planned and run by a group of high school youth who are elected by the previous year's campers. That group of students meet year-round to pick the theme verse we build our week around, plan fun activities, and even speak and lead messages at our worship services. It is a great way to experience student leadership! Ashley Gerard, along with other youth leaders from the church, serve as camp counselors for the week. ReachOut 2025 dates are July 13 – July 19.



BAGS OF BLESSINGS INFORMATION

Thank you church family for continuing to support our Bags of Blessings outreach program! We continue each month to provide vital supplies to NNEMAP Food Pantry, YWCA Family Life Center, Family Mentor Foundation, Worthington Resource Pantry, and United Methodist Children's Services School Supplies. On the first Sunday of the month, collection bags are hung on the bag tree racks with a list of needed items for that month's receiving organization. You are welcome to pick up a bag anytime during the month. Any items on the provided list are welcome, feel free to purchase what you can from the list. Purchasing all items on the list is not required. We ask that bags with your donations be returned to the church on the last Sunday of the month.

Sorting of items happens on that last Sunday of the month in the Sanctuary following the 10AM service. This involves emptying the bags and packing like items into boxes for transport to the receiving organization. Help is always needed. Feel free to come to the front of the church on bag Sundays and jump in on the fun!

The donations are then transported to the organization by Dan McIntyre or Lesly Wade. And volunteers help the office staff print and stuff new lists into the bags and hang them back on the bag tree rack for the new month.

BAGS OF BLESSINGS - JUNE

The NNEMAP Food Pantry is a cooperative ministry of over 30 churches (including WUMC) distributing food and material assistance to needy residents of Columbus. Their service area includes any zip code in Columbus. Established in 1969, NNEMAP has become one of the largest food pantries in Franklin County. Their clientele consists of families living in or near poverty. For 2024 they had 56,000 family visits and served 188,000 individuals. The pantry is located a former VFW hall at the corner of Essex and 11th Avenue, just a block west of I-71. Hours are Saturday 10 am - 1 pm, Thursday 3 pm - 6 pm, and other weekdays 9 am - noon.
