# A LETTER FROM PASTOR TAD

West Side Story, and Our Story

Janet and I recently attended a performance of West Side Story. It was a collaborative effort involving the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, BalletMet, CAPA, and Opera Columbus. It was a wonderful show. The story is a modern rendition of Romeo and Juliet, a story of rival people who don't seem to want to get along. This seems to be the story of humanity. I hope many of you were able to see it, or at least are familiar with the story. It was not only a great show, it was timely.

We seem to be experiencing some of the same kind of thing in our country right now. There is much fear and anger, hatred and anxiety. To some extent this has been with us for a long time. It's not just a recent phenomenon. Yet it seems to be especially pronounced now. And it's not just one group of people. Attacks, verbal and otherwise, against immigrants, members of the LGBTQ+ community, black people, Asians, homeless people, the elderly, all kinds of people have experienced assault of some kind. This problem may also involve us. We may be angry with some people, afraid of others, anxious about the future. This may have infected some of our personal relationships, including our families.

It isn't just an immigrant problem, that can be solved at the border. It isn't just an education problem, that can be solved through new school districts. It isn't just a racial problem, that can be solved with programs to try to help this group or that group. It isn't just a health care problem, that can be solved with cheaper insulin. It's all of this, and more. It's a problem with how we view other people. How do we view our neighbor, and who is our neighbor?

We've asked these questions before, but we need to ask them again. We can be the people who truly live out what we may refer to as the Golden Rule: do to others as you would have them do to you (Luke 6:31). That sounds so simple, and yet it is not easy. We can do this as we go about our daily lives. We can be preaching all the time without using words. This is a time for us to love others. And to have faith that God is with us now. God has not abandoned us. God is with us now. As we live in the reality of God's presence, may we share God's love with others. In the process we may ease the anxiety some people are living with. And we may ease our own fears, too. God bless you.


# VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

# **REACHOUT**

This is for those currently in 7th grade and older. ReachOut is a United Methodist Camp that happens each July in Lakeside, Ohio. If you are unfamiliar with Lakeside, it is a beautiful, gated community right on Lake Erie. One of the perks of this camp is the location itself! Campers and counselors stay in cabins and lodge housing for the week, located close to the downtown area with shops, putt-putt, and the best ice cream and donuts! There are worship services each night, a two-day mission component where we serve local non-profits around northern Ohio, sports and art activities, and a chance to get to know youth from other churches. A unique and valuable aspect of ReachOut is that it is planned and run by a group of high school youth who are elected by the previous year's campers. That group of students meet year-round to pick the theme verse we build our week around, plan fun activities, and even speak and lead messages at our worship services. It is a great way to experience student leadership! Ashley Gerard, along with other youth leaders from the church, serve as camp counselors for the week. 

# **BAGS OF BLESSINGS INFORMATION**

Thank you church family for continuing to support our Bags of Blessings outreach program! We continue each month to provide vital supplies to NNEMAP Food Pantry, YWCA Family Life Center, Family Mentor Foundation, Worthington Resource Pantry, and United Methodist Children's Services School Supplies. On the first Sunday of the month, collection bags are hung on the bag tree racks with a list of needed items for that month's receiving organization. You are welcome to pick up a bag anytime during the month. Any items on the provided list are welcome, feel free to purchase what you can from the list. Purchasing all items on the list is not required. We ask that bags with your donations be returned to the church on the last Sunday of the month.

Sorting of items happens on that last Sunday of the month in the Sanctuary following the 10AM service. This involves emptying the bags and packing like items into boxes for transport to the receiving organization. Help is always needed. Feel free to come to the front of the church on bag Sundays and jump in on the fun!

The donations are then transported to the organization by Dan McIntyre or Lesly Wade. And volunteers help the office staff print and stuff new lists into the bags and hang them back on the bag tree rack for the new month.

# **BAGS OF BLESSINGS - MARCH**

The YWCA Family Center is a comprehensive 24-hour emergency center for homeless families in Central Ohio. In 2023 the Center served 251 families, 1613 children and 282 meals covered by the community. The program provides services to help families gain independence such as employment assistance, case management, housing placement, and child advocacy. The center provides meaningful support for children and parents including licensed child care, tutoring, and a teen center while also offering amenities such as a computer resource room, laundry facilities, playgrounds and a community garden. The YWCA Family Center relies heavily on the community to assist with donations of supplies, meal hosts, and time to continue providing those in need with support. Through our Outreach Ministry, WUMC has provided support to the center through Second Mile giving, the Bags of Blessings collections, and hosting dinners for the families. For 2025, we are scheduled to host dinners on Sat. March 8, Sat. June 14, Sat. Sept. 6, and Sat. Nov. 8. Volunteer opportunities include cooking and serving the meal, and engaging in conversation and fellowship with the families. We invite you to help us provide these needed items to the families at the center. As always, feel free to purchase any or all of the items on the list.

In March we are collecting items for the Bags of Blessings for the YWCA Family Center. Please return the bags by Sunday, March 30th. Please drop off items for Bags of Blessings in the bins in the office. This month we are collecting: Aveeno Baby Wash, Baby Lotion, Desitin Cream, Baby Wipes, Pull-Ups (sizes 4T & 5T), Adult Body Wash, Bar Soap, Deodorant, Toothbrushes (adult or child), Toothpaste (adult or child).

# **OPERATION SANDWICH**

It was some 35 years ago when Barry Bennett first inspired members of our church to make sandwiches for the homeless. Barry delivered that first batch to the Friends of the Homeless Shelter, at 924 east Main Street, on Columbus' east side and we've been doing it ever since.

The Homeless Shelter houses men at night and feeds them during the day. These men are primarily from the central Columbus area. Due to increased homelessness, the shelter's nighttime capacity was recently expanded.

All attendees of our church are welcome to make sandwiches for Operation Sandwich whether you are a member or not. Make the sandwiches of meat & cheese or peanut butter & jelly. Individually wrap each sandwich and place them in the bags in which the bread was purchased. On Sunday, bring the sandwiches to the church for safe storage in the Fellowship Hall refrigerator. As you can see, making sandwiches for the homeless is not such a difficult task.

On the first weekday morning that is not a holiday, one of several members of our congregation delivers these sandwiches to the Friends of the Homeless Shelter. Driving duty is shared on a rotating basis. I coordinate these drivers, and we report the mission progress to the assistant pastor.

As mentioned, the numbers of homeless people are increasing, and the shelter's capacity has been increased to meet part of their needs. But these additional men also need to be fed. The shelter needs more sandwiches. And every loaf matters.

If you aren't already making sandwiches. Remember Matthew 25:40 says in part: 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me'.

Women's Circles, we thank you for making sandwiches a regular project. It really makes the difference. And Drivers: Thank you for the extra effort you put into the job this winter. It has been extra cold and in addition to the sandwiches, you have also served as a conduit to get Grace Bags containing hats, gloves, hand warmers and snacks to these homeless.

At the present time, we have enough drivers through June; but it looks like there will be some changes starting in July. So, if you've the time and inclination. Contact: Stephen Rohde at slrohde@att.net or 614-563-6847.
