A LETTER FROM PASTOR TAD

The Acts of the Apostles

The book in the New Testament we typically refer to as simply Acts, is more formally called the Acts of the Apostles. It is considered to be the only real history book in the NT, and it highlights the development and expansion of the early church. It tells us of the adventures of Peter and Paul and Barnabas and Lydia, among others, and some of those adventures were truly exciting: angry mobs and prison and we even read of Stephen being stoned to death. The early days of this new church were pretty wild and the apostles who were spreading the gospel had to be very committed to their work. Even though God was part of this work, it wasn't easy.

The season of Easter is the time of year when the Revised Common Lectionary includes readings from Acts in place of the usual Old Testament readings. The lectionary provides readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the New Testament Epistles, and the Gospels for each Sunday of the year, plus other special days. During the Easter season the Gospel readings tell us of post-resurrection appearances by Jesus, as well as familiar portions of John's gospel. But after Jesus ascends, the work of spreading the Good News falls to the apostles. That's the source of the title of this book because the apostles are acting to establish the new church.

There are some people who consider this book to be unfinished. The reason for that is because the work of spreading the gospel continues to this day. We are still doing the apostolic work that was started 2,000 years ago. Each individual church that has done this work has, in a sense, added a chapter to the Book of Acts. Those of us here at Worthington UMC are part of the on-going work of expanding the church. So we, also, are writing a chapter in this book. That's exciting to me. We won't get added to the Book of Acts officially, but we're doing that work.

Beginning in May, and going through Pentecost, we will include readings from Acts in our Sunday morning worship. We will be preaching from these texts and sharing in some of the excitement that is found there. We've entitled this series, Who Are We, and we'll look for some of the qualities that are part of sharing the Good News of Jesus with the world. We're also developing a study series that will look at passages from Acts that we are not including in our Sunday morning series. We hope that you will be able to participate in both aspects of our study of the Book of Acts.

The season of Lent helped prepare us for the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. The season of Easter helps prepare us for the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, but more importantly, it is a celebration of resurrection and new life. The energy we feel from this and the work of the apostles allows us to continue the work we read about in Acts. I hope you are able to keep running on Easter as we move through this season and find new inspiration from the Acts of the Apostles. God bless you.

We serve at farms, local food pantries, and learn about the on-going outreach ministries our church participates in. REACHOUT

This is for those currently in 7th grade and older. ReachOut is a United Methodist Camp that happens each July in Lakeside, Ohio. If you are unfamiliar with Lakeside, it is a beautiful, gated community right on Lake Erie. One of the perks of this camp is the location itself! Campers and counselors stay in cabins and lodge housing for the week, located close to the downtown area with shops, putt-putt, and the best ice cream and donuts! There are worship services each night, a two-day mission component where we serve local non-profits around northern Ohio, sports and art activities, and a chance to get to know youth from other churches. A unique and valuable aspect of ReachOut is that it is planned and run by a group of high school youth who are elected by the previous year's campers. That group of students meet year-round to pick the theme verse we build our week around, plan fun activities, and even speak and lead messages at our worship services. It is a great way to experience student leadership! Ashley Gerard, along with other youth leaders from the church, serve as camp counselors for the week. ReachOut 2025 dates are July 13 – July 19.




GOING GREEN CORNER

Mat Ministry

Mat Ministry turned 14 years old this April. Last year, in 2024, we made 57 mats and sent them to Open Shelter.

Would you like to learn how to cut and fold bags? Join us at our monthly plarn party. We meet on the third Wednesday of each month from 1:00-4:00pm to process the plastic bags into plarn (plastic yarn). The plarn is crocheted into a mat 3 feet by 6 feet. Completed mats are taken to Open Shelter.

Open Shelter is a day service. They help homeless and marginally housed men and women obtain State IDs, driver licenses, and birth certificates. They provide mailing addresses and supportive services like payeeships and linkage to healthcare. They also provide clothing, food, and hygiene items.

Mat Ministry is a great way to help our environment by recycling bags and help those that need assistance. Come to our next plarn party on May 21st!

BAGS OF BLESSINGS INFORMATION

Thank you church family for continuing to support our Bags of Blessings outreach program! We continue each month to provide vital supplies to NNEMAP Food Pantry, YWCA Family Life Center, Family Mentor Foundation, Worthington Resource Pantry, and United Methodist Children's Services School Supplies. On the first Sunday of the month, collection bags are hung on the bag tree racks with a list of needed items for that month's receiving organization. You are welcome to pick up a bag anytime during the month. Any items on the provided list are welcome, feel free to purchase what you can from the list. Purchasing all items on the list is not required. We ask that bags with your donations be returned to the church on the last Sunday of the month.

Sorting of items happens on that last Sunday of the month in the Sanctuary following the 10AM service. This involves emptying the bags and packing like items into boxes for transport to the receiving organization. Help is always needed. Feel free to come to the front of the church on bag Sundays and jump in on the fun!

The donations are then transported to the organization by Dan McIntyre or Lesly Wade. And volunteers help the office staff print and stuff new lists into the bags and hang them back on the bag tree rack for the new month.

BAGS OF BLESSINGS - MAY

Gates Fourth United Methodist Church is a medium-sized church located in Columbus. They welcome honor, and affirm persons of every race, gender, age, sexual orientation, nationality, ethnicity, family status, economic status, physical, mental or emotional ability into full and equal participation, membership, and lay leadership in the community of faith.

Their building is used to host a variety of community events and gatherings including AA, Al-Anon and NA; as well as a free breakfast to the entire community on the 4th and 5th Saturdays of every month.

Some breakfast guests are homeless, some are veterans and some are well off. Each guest is welcomed and provided a name tag so that others might begin to learn each other's names and more about them. Volunteers visit at the table, giving guests a chance to share their story or how the week is going. The meal is typically toast, eggs, sausage, sausage gravy, hash browns, pancakes, fruit, protein bars, juice, milk and coffee. All guests are welcome to eat their fill, using glass plates and real silverware, and to go back to the serving table as much as they require. We invite you to join us in this ministry by donating the items listed so guests can choose from these during the breakfast. FAs always, feel free to purchase any or all of the items on the list.
