Rev. Middelberg: Cyndy in Christ, you came to us from congregations where the Spirit of the

Lord was upon you; and you were charged to preach to the brokenhearted, to visit the captive, to anoint those who were bruised. These things you have done.

servants with your Spirit. We give thanks for the ministry of Cyndy, and for the ways in which you have ministered to us through her. Give her a sense of your abiding presence that she may continue to love and serve you, and ever grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ, in whose name we

pray. Amen.

Rev. Middelberg: In the book of Kings we read of the prophet Elijah's ministry. The mantle,

symbolic of submission to God, fell upon the younger prophet, Elisha, and the
